Report On Industrial Visit

Department : BBA Aviation

On **24th April 2024**, 28 students of Aviation Management Brindavan College had an industrial/educational visit to Electronic Training Institute, **Air Force Station Jalahalli (East)**. The students of 2st, 4th and 6th Semester of BBA Aviation Management along with Mr. Jyoti Ram, HOD Department of Aviation, Asst. Prof. Ganesh Singh Mahar, Asst. Prof. Amulya S, were part of the visit.

The visit was as per the Bengaluru Central University (BCU) syllabus of Bachelor of Business Administration Program (Aviation Management). The main theme of a student visit to an Indian Air Force (IAF) facility is "Exploring the World of Aviation and Defense." This theme focuses on providing students with an educational and inspiring experience that introduces them to various aspects of technology relating to aviation, available and used by the Indian Air Force, and the role of defense forces in national security. The visit aims to ignite curiosity, foster learning, and encourage students to consider careers in aviation, engineering, defense, and related fields.

Overview of the Visit:

An Industrial visit to "" Bengaluru, Karnataka was successfully organised by the Department of Aviation Management on 24th April 2024. The student of BBA Aviation Management along with three faculty went to Electronic Training Institute, Air Force Station Jalahalli (East) in college bus. The bus left the college campus by 9:15 a.m. and reached the venue at 10:00 a.m.

After the security checks the students were taken No. 5 Training Squadron to the model Aerodrome and given a briefing on the rules and guidelines to be followed by everyone inside the Aerodrome.

The students with 03 faculties visited No. 5 Training Squadron of Electronic Training Institute, Air Force Station Jalahalli, to understand the runway, taxiway, apron, runway lighting, various types of signage, approach lighting system and different types of markings on aerodrome. Also the students were briefed on various types of circuit patterns flown by the aircrafts during takeoff and landings. Instrument Landing System (ILS) and various components and their functions were also briefed to the students. Runway lighting system during night hours was also briefed to the students. The use of PAPI (precision approach path indicator) and different indications received by the pilot. The use of DME and VOR was also explained by **Sgt Vikas Kumar** and **Sgt Sohail**.

Next the students were taken to "**MODEL MAFI ROOM**" Instructor **Sgt Mithilesh kumar yadav** explained the difference between conventional runway and parallel taxi track and also he gave the detailed explanation about MAFI and then Mukesh Kumar joined us and he concluded the explanation about MAFI runway. The major difference between MAFI and conventional (old) runway is the lights are placed inside the runway. Students had many doubts on but all the doubts were cleared giving a detail explanation.

Lastly the instructor **Sgt Ratish** joined and gave some knowledge about the Rescue of Pilot and take out the pilot from a fighter aircraft cockpit, and motivated us. He was proud to be in aviation profession. All the super heroes of 5 Training Squadron of Electronic Training Institute, Air Force Station Jalahalli (east) particular aerodrome arranged Tea and snacks for all. The student of a
